

## **NEWLY DIAGNOSED HIV CASES**

individuals reported to the HIV/AIDS & ART Registry of the Philippines (HARP) [Figure 1]. Twenty-two percent (138) had clinical manifestations of advanced HIV infection<sup>*a*</sup> at the time of testing [Table 1].

Ninety-five percent (588) of the reported cases were male. The median age was 28 years old (age range: 1-71 years old). More than half of the cases (53%, 327) were 25-34 years old and 25% (157) were 15-24 years old at the time of diagnosis.



## Anti-retroviral Treatment (ART)


#### Fig. 3: Number of ART initiation per month, 2018-2020

In November 2020, there were 563 people with HIV who were initiated on ART [Figure 3]. The median CD4 of these patients upon enrollment was 108 cells/mm<sup>3</sup>.

A total of 47,334 people living with HIV (PLHIV) were presently on ART as of November 2020. Most (96%) were males. The age of reported cases ranged from 1 to 82 years (median: 32 years old). Ninety-five percent were on first line regimen, 4% were on second line, and 1% were on other line of regimen.

In November 2020, there were 620 confirmed HIV-positive Fig. 1: Number of newly diagnosed cases per month, 2018-2020




One-fifth (22%, 136) were from the National Capital Region (NCR). Region 4A (16%, 102), Region 6 (14%, 89), Region 3 (13%, 84), and Region 10 (7%, 41) comprised the top five regions with the most number of newly reported cases for this reporting period, together accounting for 72% of the total cases [Figure 2].

Sexual contact remained as the predominant mode of transmission (98%, 605). Among the newly reported cases infected through sexual contact, 12% (74) were through male to female sex, 61% (368) reported transmission through male to male sex, and 30% (163) through males who have sex with both males and females. Further, three (<1%) were infected through mother-to-child transmission and one case (<1%) was infected through sharing of needles. Eleven cases (2%) had no data on mode of transmission.

In November 2020, 7 were reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. Three cases were from the NCR; two from Region 3, and one case each from Regions 4A and 10.

#### Fig. 2: Proportion of newly diagnosed cases by region of residence, Nov 2020 (N=620)






## HIV/AIDS EPIDEMIC TRENDS IN THE PHILIPPINES (January 1984 - November 2020)

The first case of HIV infection in the Philippines was reported in 1984. Since then, there have been 81,789 confirmed HIV cases reported to the HARP. Ninety-four percent (76,804) of those diagnosed were male<sup>e</sup> and 6% (4,974) were female<sup>e</sup>. At the time of diagnosis, more than half (51%, 41,490) were 25-34 years old<sup>1</sup> while 23,460 (29%) were youth 15-24 years old'. The median age was 28 years old (age range: 1 month - 82 years). Thirteen percent (10,690) of the reported cases had clinical manifestations of advanced infection<sup>g</sup> at the time of reporting [Figure 4]. Moreover, 73% (59,335) of the total diagnosed cases in the Philippines were reported from January 2015 to November 2020.

## Age and Sex

In the early years of the epidemic (1984-1990), 62% (133 Fig. 5: Number of diagnosed females per year, of 216 cases) of those diagnosed were female. However, since 1991 the proportion of diagnosed males has been greater than that of females each year. From 1991 to present, males comprised 94% (76,721) of the 81,573<sup>e</sup> diagnosed cases in the Philippines. In addition, from January 2018 to November 2020, three percent (862) of 29,551 diagnosed cases who were assigned male at birth their self-identity<sup>h</sup> as female (transgender reported women).

The number of diagnosed HIV infections among females has also been increasing in the past ten years (2011-2020) [Figure 5]. From January to November 2020, 375 females were diagnosed with HIV, which was three times higher compared with cases reported in 2011 (139). Ninety-two percent (4,596) of all female cases since 1984 were in the reproductive age group (15-49 years old) at the time of testing.

The predominant age group among those diagnosed has shifted to 25-34 years old starting 2006 from 35-49 years old in 2001 to 2005 [Figure 6]. Further, the proportion of HIV positive cases in the 15-24 year age group nearly doubled in the past ten years, from 17% in 2000 to 2009 to 30% in 2010 to 2019.


## Geographic distribution


From January 1984 to November 2020, the regions with Table 2: Number of HIV cases diagnosed by region of residence the most number of reported cases were NCR with 30,758 (38%) cases, Region 4A with 12,569 (15%) cases, Region 3 with 8,089 (10%) cases, Region 7 with 6,857 (8%) cases, and Region 11 with 4,489 (5%) cases. Twenty-two percent (17,889) of the cases came from the rest of the country while 1,138 (1%) did not report region of residence [Table 2].

Of the 4,974 females reported with HIV, 1,299 (26%) were from NCR, 760 (15%) were from Region 3, 606 (12%) were from Region 4A, 586 (12%) were from Region 7 and 1,420 (29%) were from other regions; while 303 (6%) had no reported data on region of residence.

The regions with the most number of Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) reported to HARP were from NCR with 2,402 (31%) cases, Region 4A with 1,325 (17%) cases, and Region 3 with 969 (13%) cases.

# Modes of transmission (MOT)

From January 1984 to November 2020, sexual contact among males who have sex with males [MSM] (86%, 65,818) was the predominant MOT, followed by malefemale sex (10%, 8,040), and sharing of infected needles (3%, 2,198). More than half of MSM (52%, 34,403) were 25-34 years old at the time of testing, and 31% (20,287) were 15-24 years old. Among diagnosed females, malefemale sex was the most common MOT (93%, 4,621) followed by sharing of infected needles (3%, 137) [Table 3].

A total of 210 children (less than 10 years old<sup>n</sup>), eight adolescents (10-19 years old<sup>n</sup>), and one adult foreigner (22 years old<sup>n</sup>) were reported to have acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission.

From 1984 to 2006, the predominant MOT was male-female sex. From 2007, the trend shifted to sexual contact among MSM as the predominant MOT and has remained as such to the present. From January 2015 to November 2020, 84% (49,819) out of the total (59,335) diagnosed cases were among MSM.


From 1984 to 2009, transmission through sharing of infected needles was less than one percent of the total cases reported. The proportion of HIV cases among people who inject drugs (PWID) increased sharply in 2010, at 9% (147) of the total cases reported that year. Further, the proportion of new cases among PWID remained at less than 6% of the total cases in the succeeding years.

Regional patterns vary across different MOT. Forty percent (26,498) of ever diagnosed males who have sex with males were from NCR; almost all (99%, 2,328) reported cases among people who inject drugs were from Region 7; and 31% (96) of females who engaged in transactional sex were from Region 3.

# Youth (15-24 years old)

In November 2020, 157 (25%) cases were among youth 15-24 years old and 95% were male. Almost all (99%, 156) were infected through sexual contact (15 male-female sex, 96 male-male sex, 45 sex with both males & females<sup>m</sup>) and one (1%) had no data on the MOT.

From January 1984 to November 2020, 23,460 (29%) of the reported cases were 15-24 years old. Ninety-seven percent (22,818) were infected through sexual contact (2,531 male-female sex, 13,862 male-male sex, 6,425 sex with both males & females<sup>*m*</sup>), 479 (2%) were infected through sharing of needles, one (<1%) was infected through mother-to-child transmission, and 162 (1%) had no data on the MOT. Seventy-five percent (17,592 out of 23,460) of all those 15-24 years old at the time of testing were diagnosed from January 2015 to November 2020. Since 2004, more males were diagnosed from this age group. However, the number of diagnosed HIV cases among female youth had increased significantly in the past five years. The total diagnosed females aged 15-24 years old in January to November 2020 (112) was 37% higher compared with the same reporting period (82) in 2015.


## Children (<10) & Adolescents (10-19)

In November 2020, there were 28 newly reported adolescents. Of these, two were 15-17 years old and 26 were 18-19 years old. All adolescents were infected through sexual contact (3 male-female sex, 20 male-male sex, 5 sex with both males & females<sup>4</sup>). Further, three children were reported with HIV in this reporting period and all were infected through mother-to-child transmission.

Four percent (3,520) of all diagnosed cases from January 1984 to November 2020 were 19 years old and younger at the time of diagnosis. Of these, six percent (216) were children less than 10 years old. Among the children, 210 (97%) were infected through mother-to-child transmission; one (<1%) through blood transfusion; and five (2%) had no data on MOT. Subsequently, 94% (3,304 out of 3,520) were adolescents. Twenty-seven were 10-14 years old, 488 were 15-17 years old and 2,789 were 18-19 years old. Of the adolescents, 96% (3,174) were infected through sexual contact (399 male-female sex, 2,040 male-male sex, and 735 sex with both males & females<sup>q</sup>), 90 (3%) were infected through sharing of infected needles, 8 (<1%) through mother-to-child transmission, and 32 (1%) had no data on MOT.

## **Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW)**

Forty-four Filipinos who worked overseas within the past five years, whether on land or at sea, were newly reported in November 2020. They comprised 7% of the total cases for this period. Of these, 91% (40) were male.






People who engage in transactional sex are those who reported that they either pay for sex, regularly accept payment for sex, or do both. Reporting of transactional sex was included in the HARP starting December 2012.

In November 2020, 12% (73) of the newly diagnosed engaged in transactional sex [Table 4]. Ninety-nine percent (72) were male and aged from 18 to 52 years old (median: 29 years). Fifty-four percent (39) of the males reported paying for sex only, 26% (19) reported accepting payment for sex only and 20% (14) engaged in both. Further, the only female case who engaged in transactional sex was reported to have accepted payment for sex only [Table 4].

A total of 8,606 cases reported to HARP from December 2012 to November 2020 were people who engaged in transactional sex. Ninety-six percent (8,300) were male. There were 4,625 (54%) who paid for sex, 2,705 (31%) who accepted payment for sex, and 1,276 (15%) who engaged in both [Table 4].

Further, 98% (39) of the male cases were infected through sexual contact (4 male-female sex, 20 malemale sex, and 15 sex with both males and females<sup>4</sup>) and one had no data on mode of transmission. The ages of male OFWs ranged from 24 to 71 years (median: 30 years). Half (20) of the male cases were 25-34 years old at the time of testing and 35% (14) were 35-49 years old. All of the four female OFWs where infected through sexual contact. Seventy-five percent (3) were 25-34 years older at the time of testing and 25% (1) were 50 years and older. The age range among diagnosed female OFWs were from 36 to 67 years (median: 48 years old).

From January 1984 to November 2020, 9% (7,648) of the total cases were OFWs [Figure 9]. Of these, 6,652 (87%) were male. Almost all (99%, 6,571) of male cases were infected through sexual contact (1,643 malefemale sex, 2,937 male-male sex and 1,991 sex with both males and females<sup>4</sup>). The ages of male OFWs ranged from 16 to 80 years (median: 32 years). Among 996 female OFWs, 97% (969) were infected through sexual contact. The ages of female OFWs ranged from 20 to 73 years (median: 34 years old).

## Pregnant women living with HIV


Reporting of pregnancy status at the time of diagnosis was Fig. 10: Number of HIV positive women who were pregnant at the included in the HARP starting year 2011.

From January to November 2020, there were 92 HIV positive women reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. Of these, 36% (33) were from NCR, 22% (20) were from Region 4A, 17% (16) were from Region 3 and 25% (23) were from the rest of the country. The age of diagnosis ranged from 15 to 45 years old (median age: 25).

Since 2011, a total of 482 diagnosed women were reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. More than half (52%, 250) were 15-24 years old at the time of diagnosis, and 40% (193) were 25-34 years old [Figure 10]. The regions with highest number of diagnosed pregnant cases with HIV were NCR (45%, 215), Region 7 (19%, 88), Region 4A (12%, 57), Region 3 (8%, 40), and Region 11 (4%, 17).

## **DEATHS AMONG PEOPLE WITH HIV**

In November 2020, there were 80<sup>r</sup> reported deaths due to any cause among people with HIV. Ninety-six percent (77) were males [Table 5]. Nine (11%) cases were 15-24 years old, 44 (55%) were 25-34 years old, 22 (28%) were 35-49 vears old and 5 (6%) were 50 years and older. All were reported to have acquired HIV through sexual contact (14 through sex with male and female, 53 through male-male sex, and 13 through sex with both males and females').

A total of 4,523 deaths were reported from January 1984 to November 2020, and 92% (4,166) of whom were male. Twenty-nine (1%) were less than 15 years old<sup>s</sup> at the time of death, 665 (15%) were 15-24 years old<sup>s</sup>, 2,267 (50%) were 25-34 years old<sup>s</sup>, 1,278 (28%) were 35-49 years old<sup>s</sup>, and 282 (6%) were 50 years and older<sup>s</sup> [Table 5].

Sexual contact (96%) was the most common mode of HIV transmission among reported deaths (884 through malefemale sex, 2,222 through male-male sex, 1,222 through sex with both males and females<sup>t</sup>). Other modes of transmission of reported deaths were sharing of infected needles (2%, 107), mother-to-child transmission (1%, 28), and blood transfusion (<1%, 9) [Figure 11]<sup>u</sup>.

#### HIV/AIDS & ART Registry of the Philippines (HARP)

The HARP is the official record of total number of diagnoses (laboratory-confirmed), ART outcome status and deaths among people with HIV in the Philippines.

All individuals in the registry are confirmed by the San Lazaro Hospital STD/AIDS Cooperative Central Laboratory (SACCL) which is the HIV/ AIDS National Reference Laboratory (NRL) and DOH Certified Rapid HIV Diagnostic Algorithm - rHIVda Confirmatory Laboratories (CrCLs). Confirmed HIV positive individuals were reported to the DOH-Epidemiology Bureau (EB) and recorded to HARP.

ART figures are counts of HIV positive adult and pediatric patients currently enrolled and accessing Antiretroviral (ARV) medication during the reporting period in 126 treatment hubs and primary HIV care treatment facilities that had reported in the HARP. This report did not include patients who have previously taken ARV but have died, left the country, have been lost to follow-up and/or opted not to take ARV. Lost to follow-up is considered once a person have failed to visit a treatment facility more than 3 months after the expected date of ARV refill.

HARP is a passive surveillance system. Except for HIV confirmation by the NRL & CrCLs, all other data submitted to the HARP are secondary and cannot be verified. Hence, HARP cannot determine if an individual's reported place of residence is where the person got infected, or where the person lived after being infected, or where the person is presently living. This limitation has major implications on data interpretation. Readers are advised to interpret the data with caution and consider other sources of information before arriving at conclusions. conclusions
