



Thai MSM/TG PrEP Substudy Objectives


• To determine the uptake of PrEP among HIV-negative MSM/TG and factors associated with PrEP acceptance

Among MSM/TG who take PrEP

- To assess adherence to PrEP and retention in PrEP programs
- To assess the proportion who continue PrEP when they are required to pay for PrEP medicine
- To compare the acceptance of PrEP, adherence to PrEP, and retention rate at community-based and facility-based sites




PrEP enrollment results (Lerdsen and Thammasat)
