PMTCT in Nepal

- Comprehensive PMTCT service started in Nepal from February 2005.
- Government provides free ARV drugs and follow-up testing for the baby free of cost from 18 months.
- There are 17 PMTCT sites, of which 16 sites offer Pediatric ART and 5 sites provide CD4 testing onsite.
