
Factsheet 1: HIV Epidemic Update of Nepal, as of December 2015

Facts about HIV Epidemic in Nepal

- The first HIV case was detected in 1988.
- The key populations are as follows:
 - R People who inject drugs (PWID)
 - Sex workers and their clients (Male and Female)
 - Men who have Sex with Men (MSM) and transgender people
 - X Male Labor Migrants and their wives
 - Prison Inmates
- Heterosexual transmission is dominant
- HIV prevalence among adult population in the country is below 1%


- Estimated number of people living with HIV: 39,397





